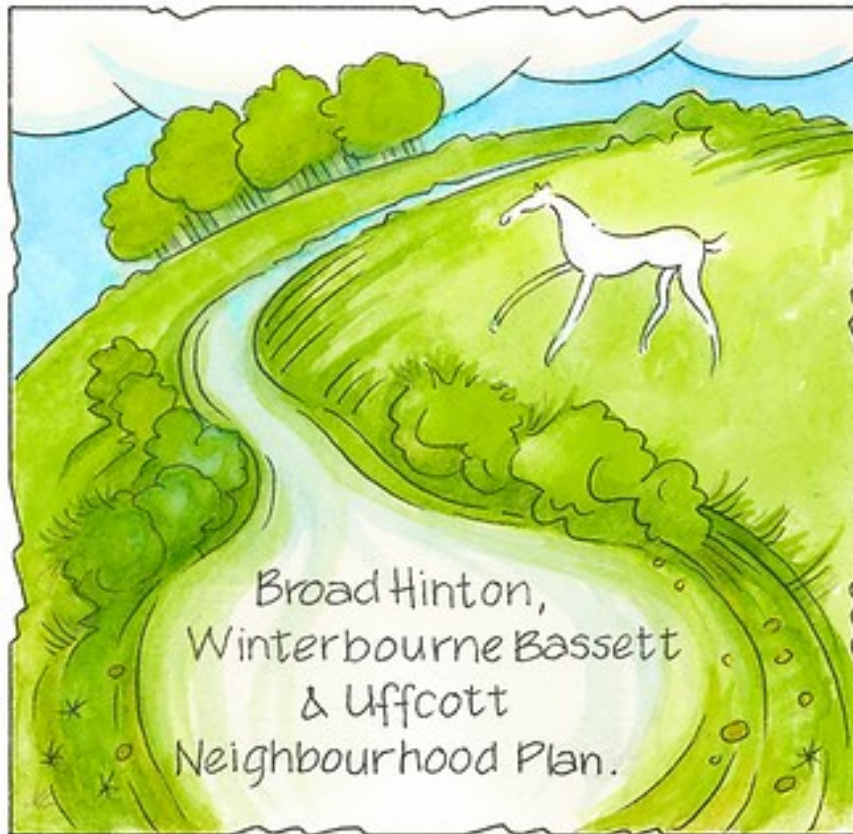

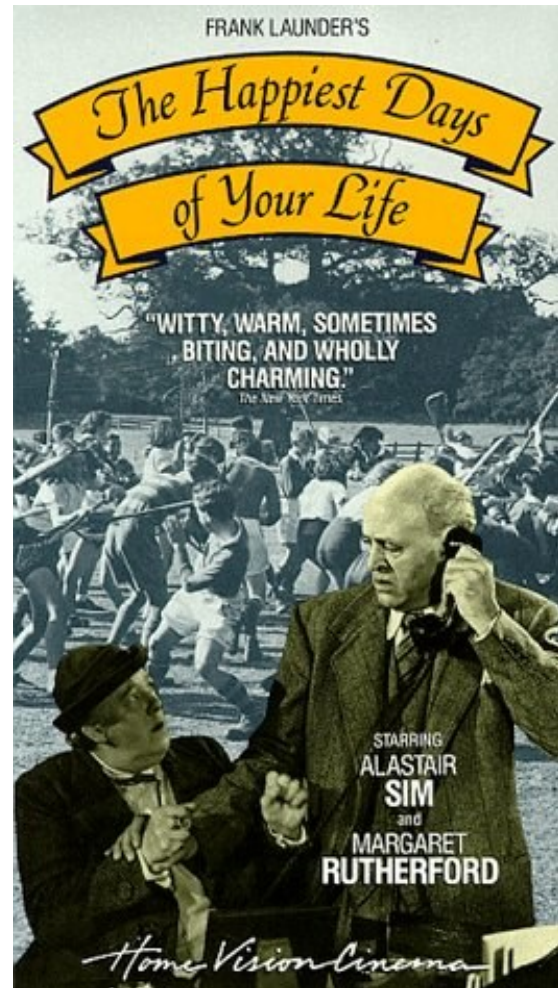

PCC Philip Wilkinson's February Parish Column

Delivering a police service which meets the needs of its communities has never been more important – or challenging. I know residents want greater public engagement with officers, more public access to officers and an increased officer presence at community level.

Wiltshire Police is addressing this with the introduction of a new operating model with neighbourhood teams providing visible, neighbourhood-focused, policing and delivering a recent improvement programme to provide a better-quality service 999 and 101 callers.

My commitment has been to invest in mobile police stations so our rural communities receive the same level of service, improve Melksham Custody so it is fit-for-purpose and the future, invest in training facilities to provide an exemplary environment to equip our police officers to keep you safe and to challenge the force to consistently provide a quality service to residents – regardless of location.

All of this is underpinned by the importance of investment in police 'estate' to support the delivery of a policing service I know our residents want - and deserve.

My newly-launched Estates Strategy sets out this vision. I believe Wiltshire Police will be better equipped to provide the policing service our communities want if they have the infrastructure which supports them to respond more effectively and efficiently. The strategy ensures we have well-placed police stations and hubs providing a base for our staff to work smarter, adapt to changing crime and, more importantly, ensuring that not only will communities be safer but they will start to feel safer too. View from the Rectory February 2024

As Phil and I prepare to leave and 'Go West' to serve God I have been reflecting on the last 13 years as new ways of working together as a single PCC begins to take shape. I remember coming off the M4 and stopping on Hackpen Hill, seeing the spire of Broad Hinton church wondering 'here, Lord?' then visiting each of the churches in turn before heading to Avebury for a meet and greet. It was February, Phil was overseas, but fully aware of the strength of calling, and as always, his wonderful supportive self. Two days later I was appointed as your priest and we have journeyed together until now, the parting of our pilgrim ways, but very much not the end of either journey as we seek what next for us within the will of God.

We have weathered much together, grieved together, rejoiced together, had differences of opinions, found new ways of worshipping, and new ways of reaching people and offering support to others in the name of Jesus. Some of the experiences we have shared have been joyful and up lifting full of God's presence, others more challenging of our faith in God, not least of which being a global Pandemic, and yet God has been found there, in the struggles, too. We never thought we would be using livestreaming and social media as a matter of course to share our faith, support the isolated and continue to communicate in ways taken for granted by younger generations – but we are. Yet the BCP services that brings comfort in familiar rhythms and words continue, alongside Muddy Church, Celtic Communion and Taizé, and more services are being led by our very able team of Lay Worship Leaders. God has enabled and equipped us over the years to work through difficulties and God is already at work ahead of us in the new journey ahead.

Like pilgrims on the Ridgeway, we journey together for a time, supporting, encouraging, learning, stubbing toes and getting along or on each other's nerves. God walks in our midst and nothing we need for the journey is unprovided by God – all we have to do is recognise the provision. There is one Messiah, Jesus, and He is the one we follow – for me and Phil to Canada, for you on a journey of discovery into what it means to be one United Body of Christ across the villages of the Upper Kennet. This journey is now in your hands, and I have every confidence that with God's provision, God's equipping of you, and God's Blessing, you will grow in strength, faith and commitment to one another and to God. God is already at work calling the right person to help guide you, and while that person will come trusting in God's call, it is for you to continue to exercise the ministry of the royal priesthood God calls us to be – that the love of God for all might be shown in the authentic way we live our lives. Like pilgrims passing on a mountain trail, let us rejoice in our journey together this far and say Go with God, Fare Thee Well, as we part. And in the words of some dear friends 'Merry meet, Merry part, and Merry meet again' in this world, or the next.

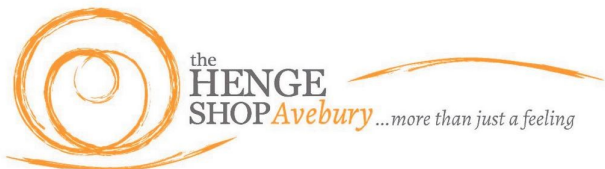

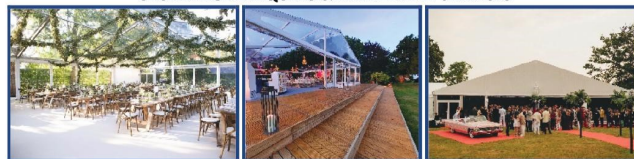
