Car Park Work Complete.

Thanks to those of you who are now parking within the white lines, it feels like we're accommodating more cars as a result! However, there are still people parking long cars in the spaces intended for small cars. Long vehicles in these spaces overlap onto the road, which can be dangerous for pedestrians, especially near the school and makes it difficult at times for the people in the houses opposite to pull on and off their drives.

If you have a long car and there's no long spaces left, please park elsewhere. Conversely, if you arrive early with a small car, please don't take up the longer spaces which could be used by those with larger cars – park in the shorter spaces.

The small spaces were bonus spaces, added when we removed the front garden which was causing a lot of work. If we didn't have those, we'd have far fewer spaces. Given that as a community, we are so very short on parking, for the village hall, the school, and everything else, we must make the best use of the parking we do have.

New Projector Screen.

In a triumph for health & safety, we have ditched the old projector screen, which was really very hungry for fingers. We now have a new portable screen, which is easy to carry and put up. REACH OUT to the “OUTREACH SERVICE!”



In a world that is fast becoming dehumanised due to a greater reliance on technology, AI and online services, this local Outreach service is **re-humanising** our society!

We are so lucky in this country, particularly in the rural areas, to still have sub-postmasters and postmistresses who, in spite of the recent Post Office /Fujitsu scandal and mismanagement by the Post Office executives, have continued to provide us with an amazing service. This is in the face of the threats of decline in post due to rising postage costs and the use of the internet. There are many countries where a postal service no longer exists.

Many of these postmasters and postmistresses also run village shops, providing a vital lifeline for rural life.

Long before the pandemic, during the pandemic, where it was considered safe, and beyond 2020, one of our fantastic Wiltshire sub-postmistresses, Tina, based in a Wiltshire village, took on the commitment to run an Outreach Post Office service. As one of her colleagues pointed out there are only 110 such dedicated individuals in England. Tina has been serving several villages every day of the week; this means she is travelling considerable distances, often battling the elements, sometimes facing dangerous conditions such as flooding or ice and snow, to meet her obligations to provide the Post Office service for two or three hours a day.

Tina's work and others like her, saves many of us tedious journeys to larger towns with the worry of parking and queues.

The Post Office service has also been a lifesaver in the sense that while we have been abandoned by the banks in our high streets up and down the country, as they attempt to force us all to go online, or create a cashless society, the Post Office provides many banking services. Where banks have closed, so have the cash machines. In the Outreach service, it's possible to draw cash, pay in cash and pay in cheques, providing you have the correct paperwork.

We have also to thank the Royal Mail staff, who throughout the pandemic, again in all weather conditions, kept going with mail delivery and collections, which again, was a fantastic lifeline for many, when we were forced to lead a very isolated existence. When you could not visit a friend or relative you could still send or receive a letter, a card, a

small parcel. Emails hit us relentlessly, daily. Nothing lifts the spirit so much as a letter through the letter box, as long as it is not a bill!

These sub-postmistresses and postmasters, essentially working at the heart of communities, are acutely aware of hardship, depression, and loneliness because they engage on a very human level; the Outreach service could be said to provide a 'portal' to an awareness of social needs. Lack of social interaction is aggravated by the isolationism of so many individuals working from home. The first message you receive from many organisations is to search for information online. The alternative is to endure lengthy waiting times to speak to a 'human'. We are becoming a dehumanised society.

Services like Outreach are **re-humanising**!

However this service is also threatened by the continual reviews carried out by the administrative side of Post Office management, measuring 'footfall', and attempting to reduce hours, probably due to the fact they have to reduce costs as a result of the recent mismanagement of the Horizon scandal.

In addition, the administrative arm of The Royal Mail recently gave the Outreach services two weeks' notice of an ultimatum that they would no longer ask their vans to collect the mail from the various hubs, even though the vans were still collecting yards away from post boxes!

If I were an Outreach sub-postmistress/postmaster, continually undermined by an organisation I represented and worked for, I would probably just wish to give up.

There are still many people in the various villages in which there is an Outreach provision who are not aware of this service. It does take time and planning to make sure that we are aware of locations, times and days to access Outreach. ?

Tina was awarded a medal by the Lord Lieutenant of Wiltshire for her services to the community. It was well deserved; apart from all she and her husband do in their local community, Tina has been tireless in the provision of Outreach, but we take such a service for granted at a cost.

It is important to recognise what effort she makes daily for our convenience and to support and value her and others like her, who give this provision.
