Thanks to everyone that attended our farmers' market event at the village hall, we hope you enjoyed your purchases! We are sorry to later visitors some stalls were sold out or very sparse – there were many more early birds than we had imagined, but we now know what to expect next time. Yes, we are planning to do it again, hopefully in early February – and perhaps then every 3 or 4 months. Our thanks to those who helped cover the cost of this first event by donating at the coffee counter.



Thank you to those who filled in our survey - we've been overwhelmed with the response and grateful for the frankness of your comments. We want to record the full spectrum of opinion and give everyone a say who wants one - there's still time so if you haven't done the survey already, do it here: <http://bhwbparishcouncil.org.uk/shop-survey>

In your responses you agree with us that there is no point in setting up a business just to repeat past failures, but you also showed your support for a new vision, one based on the many successful community-owned shops in similar villages to ours. We are using your answers alongside trading figures from these businesses to ensure that a new shop will be viable.

Finding a location is still the really big hurdle – what many other communities have done to create a premises, such as extending a village hall or taking over an unused small building, are not easy options for us. The ideal scenario is of course a central, easily accessible location in Broad Hinton, visible to passing trade and with suitable parking close by.

Many of you suggested The Crown Inn as the obvious solution but we have already explored this without success. Arkell's Brewery, who own the site, took time to consider it, but decided that they could not make any exceptions to their policy against subletting at their properties. We continue to evaluate other possibilities and to get ready to act on any opportunities that arise.

We have made a good start as a community with pledging to buy withdrawable community shares to part-fund the shop project. If you are able to contribute to this, please fill in a pledge form - even if you can only pledge £10 now it will help us to have an idea what financial support we can raise - especially important when asking for the grant funding we also need. Pledges are non-binding, you can change your mind later.

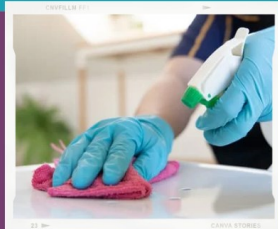

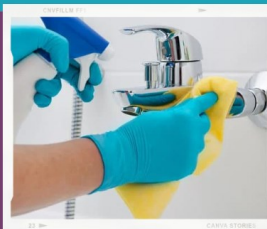

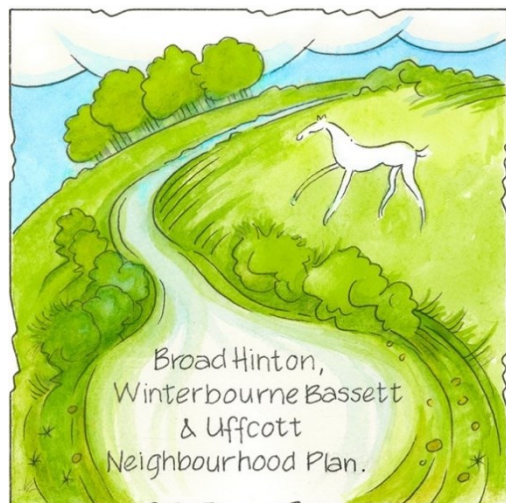

Neighbourhood Plan Latest Update

We have news on our Neighbourhood Development Plan's (NDP) Regulation 14 consultation. This is the period of six weeks public consultation and is a formal part of the process of approving the NDP.

To start the process, we hope to arrange a meeting in January, where we will:

- Present the policies in the NDP
- Explain the consultation process
- Let you know how and where you can see the NDP
- Notify you of how you can submit comments on the NDP

Submitting comments is a formal part of the Regulation 14 process. During the meeting, the NDP Steering Group will be available for you to ask questions about the process, but we won't be able to accept comments verbally. Comments must be submitted in writing, and we will respond in writing and publish these anonymised.

Once the Regulation 14 process is complete, we will decide whether to amend the neighbourhood plan in response to each comment. The decisions on whether to amend the plan, and the reasoning behind them, will be recorded and we will notify everyone if we are changing any part of the NDP as a result.

This information will be incorporated into the Consultation Statement, which we submit to Wiltshire Council with the NDP at Regulation 16 stage. During this stage Wiltshire Council will:

Publicise the NDP for a 6-week period.

Pass any comments/representations they receive to the independent examiner for consideration.

THE RIDGEWAY LADIES

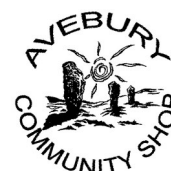
On Wednesday October 2nd the ladies met at the White Hart in Wroughton for their annual skittles night.

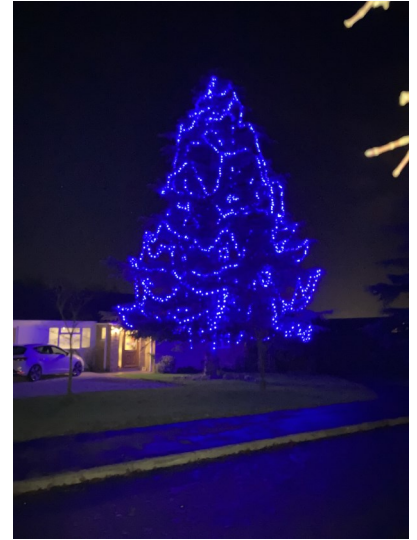
Broad Hinton Blue Tree Returns This Christmas

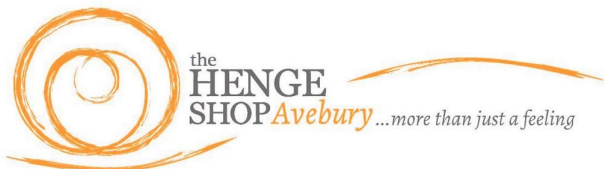

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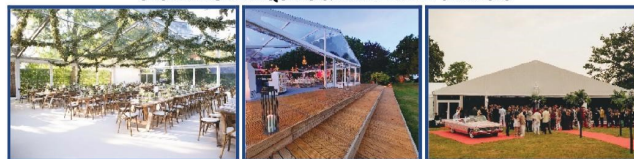
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
