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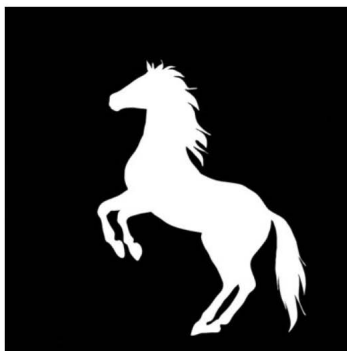

Understanding Today's AI: A Friend, an Artist, and Sometimes a Trickster

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is no longer just the stuff of science fiction—it's part of our everyday lives, even in places we might not expect. While it may sound complex, this guide will help you, our parish readers, understand AI's current abilities and how it can both help and challenge us.

AI as an Artist: Generating Images



One of the most intriguing things about modern AI is its ability to create art. This means that with just a description, an AI program can produce a picture. For example, imagine describing a deer and a bird of prey in the Wiltshire countryside with standing stones. An AI can take that vision and produce an image that looks remarkably like a photograph or a painting. This kind of image generation can be helpful for designing materials, illustrating articles, or simply exploring creative ideas without needing to pick up a paintbrush. However, while these tools can create



beautiful images, they can sometimes generate scenes that don't match reality. For instance, an AI might depict a beautiful landscape but add unrealistic details like purple trees and flying deer. This

illustrates that while AI can mimic art and photos, it doesn't always know what is plausible and what isn't.

AI's Trickier Side: Twisting the Truth

Beyond artwork, AI can also generate text. This ability can be extremely helpful for tasks like drafting emails, creating lesson plans, or writing newsletters.

However, there's a word of caution: AI doesn't have a sense of truth. It can easily write plausible-sounding content that isn't accurate. For instance, when asked to write about historical events, an AI might include some correct facts mixed with completely fabricated ones.

Why does this happen? AI systems are trained on vast amounts of data from the internet, books, and other sources. While this makes them very knowledgeable, it also means they can learn incorrect information or combine details in ways that aren't true.

For readers and users of AI, this means one important thing: double-checking. If AI writes a piece for you or generates an image, it's wise to review it for accuracy and realism.

Alleviating Workloads: A Helping Hand

On the bright side, AI is very good at making tasks easier. Parish staff, for example, could use AI tools to draft the first version of a bulletin, freeing up time for more meaningful, personal work. AI can also help with organizing schedules, responding to common questions, or even summarizing lengthy documents.

Imagine spending hours less on administrative work and more time connecting with the community. This is the potential AI offers: automating repetitive tasks so people can focus on what they do best—being creative, empathetic, and human.

The article above was written by AI and both of the images were also produced by AI.

My prompt for the images was: A large bird of prey and a deer in a Wiltshire landscape with standing stones, ethereal.

My prompt for the AI essay was: Write an article about the current ability of AI. The audience is generally older and the medium is a local parish magazine. Show how AI can generate images, and twist the truth as well as how it can help alleviate workload.

White Horse Community Shop & Café: January Update



White Horse
Community Shop

Finding a location for a new shop/cafe in Broad Hinton has continued to prove tricky for the steering group, but, in the meantime, we will delight in bringing you more local shopping opportunities!

**Our next Farmers' Market is on Sunday 16th February,
11am-2pm,
at Broad Hinton Village Hall!**

Thank you very much for the combined 90 responses to our questionnaire or mini-survey. It's heartening to know you support what we are doing - on average you thought re-establishing a shop was 4 out of 5 on the importance scale and indeed 5 was the most popular answer. On that basis we are not giving up just yet!

Some of you expressed doubt as to whether a new shop could be viable, since previous incarnations had closed. This initial phase of our project - researching, listening to all ideas, and gathering your opinions - is all about working out what *is* likely to succeed, and how and where we might make it work. We absolutely agree that we mustn't set ourselves up to repeat past failures or ignore what our community wants and would be best served by.

Getting quality local produce on offer regularly in our community is one of our core motivations. Lots of you said that if the shop offered what you want to buy most frequently - especially locally produced fresh goods you can't get at the supermarket and that you're already going elsewhere to buy - you will choose our shop and divert some of your spend back into our community. However, you also said that you would tend not to use the business if it wasn't good value or too much of a compromise on quality, ethics or sustainability.

Thank you for also answering honestly on what you saw yourselves spending in our imaginary future shop/café. We are using your responses alongside business data from existing community-owned shops and cafés to ensure we have a viable business plan before we go any further. So far, we remain cautiously optimistic, we don't think there is any reason we can't succeed.

We are grateful to those who said they'd volunteer in the business even at this early stage of the project. This will be very important, enabling it to operate at lower cost and risk, while we get ourselves up and running. Your offers of volunteering hours are enough to open the business over a worthwhile amount of time across the week, and that's great news.

25 incredible people pledged to buy a total of £7,000 of shares in our future community-owned business, we think this is an excellent start. We'll come back to the share offer later, when we are nearer to needing to spend money, but for now we have a good idea what we might be able to raise and with which to obtain match-funded grants.

So, while our efforts to establish an "open-all-hours" business continue into 2025 we will see where regular farmers' markets take us and enjoy at least the occasional bite of what many of you agree is mostly missing from our community. See you all again soon...
