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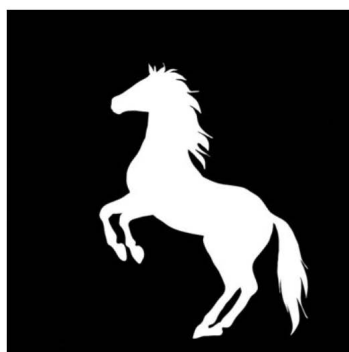

The popular handmade soups will be making their return and we are excited to welcome a new local floral business offering cut-flowers and plants.

Apples - do you 🍏 them?

There was disappointment at the May market as we'd already sold out of our community apple juice, we plan to make more, read on! Thank you to all those who'd previously purchased some, hope you enjoyed it, and to the two households who donated apples, it's been a significant help in allowing us to continue the markets.

While getting the juice pressed we learned that not long ago there were thousands of different varieties of apples growing in the British Isles whether consumed as dessert apples, cooked into pies, or used in cider making. Nowadays it is rare to find more than four or five varieties on sale in the supermarket and much of the fruit imported.

Very sadly British orchards have been grubbed up for decades, the few that remain are seriously under threat as farmers struggle to find a market for varieties that don't fit the big grocers' rigid requirements. It's understandable how we have got here, and how difficult it is to turn back the clock as regards apples and our food system.

Meanwhile, with our busy lives, a lot of home-grown, better, more interesting apples aren't picked in time and are all left to wasps and rot or not eaten and sent to landfill. Old garden trees get removed to make space for other things and before we know it we've lost all that diversity too. But perhaps as a community we can do a bit more to change that while literally enjoying the fruits of our labours.

So, if you've got apples growing in your garden and might have some you are not going to make use of, even if it might not be very many, the community shop/cafe steering group are keen to take them away for sale at our markets or for juicing - any profit made will support our community. You might not be ready to think about mists and mellow fruitfulness amid midsummer heatwaves, but for now please do drop us a line with your details to Claire Le Gresley claire@legresley.me.uk 07729 011370. 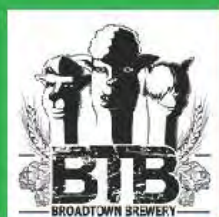

As I mentioned at the start of the season in the Local News, the ground should really be seen as a community asset. Community Speed Watch launch

We are thrilled to announce the launch of the Community Speed Watch Scheme right here in Broad Hinton!

For those who may not be familiar, a Community Speed Watch Scheme is a community-driven initiative that empowers local residents to take an active role in making our roads safer. By monitoring vehicle speeds, we can help to reduce speeding and raise awareness about the importance of safe driving in our villages.

Results from the Community Questionnaire in 2022 helped the Parish Council identify areas of improvement, one of these areas being road safety. This project, along with reduction in speeds on the A4361, liaising with the school on their Traffic Plan and the upcoming rollout of Speed Indication Devices (smiley/sad face sign), aims to address some of the road safety issues identified.

The Parish Council has been working with Wiltshire Council to understand traffic patterns in Broad Hinton, and last year we conducted a speed survey that identified significant speeding issues on Yew Tree Lane.



This finding has led us to focus our initial efforts in that area, ensuring we address the problem where it matters most.

The team behind this initiative is led by David Followell and includes Tracy Fieldsend and Adam Gilmore, all of whom are dedicated to making Broad Hinton a safer place for everyone. We will officially kick off on the morning of **Thursday June 19th**, so don't be surprised if you see us in our high-visibility jackets, equipped with a radar gun, helping to keep an eye on traffic speeds.

If you're caught speeding by the Community Speed Watch scheme, your vehicle details and speed will be recorded and passed on to the local police. First-time offenders will receive a warning letter as a reminder to stick to the speed limits. For persistent offenders, the police may follow up with a personal visit to discuss the issue and provide further education.

The goal of the scheme is to educate and encourage safer driving habits within our community.

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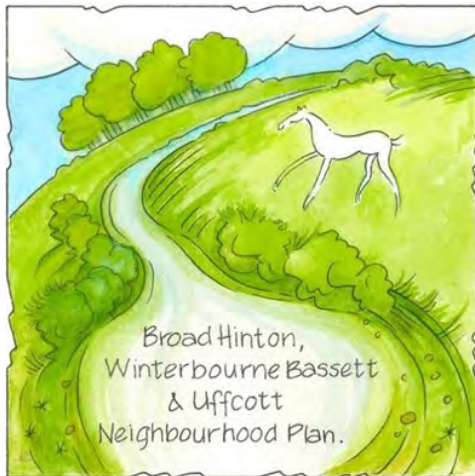
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Neighbourhood Plan Update

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PCC: Keeping communities informed with digital tools

In recent years, my office has worked hard to improve transparency and engagement between the police and the public and I've always been an advocate Police websites, starting with the 'Your Area' section of the Wiltshire Police homepage. That's why I want to highlight some key tools available on both the OPCC and Wiltshire Police websites, starting with the 'Your Area' section of the Wiltshire Police homepage.

This platform allows you to input your postcode and acts as a window into your neighbourhood's policing activity by showing up to date local crime stats, so you can see what's happening in your community—from burglary to antisocial behaviour—and how trends are changing.

We know that a visible police presence matters to communities, and my office has recently invested in two new mobile police stations to make policing services more accessible, even in the most rural of areas.

You will soon be able to find upcoming dates and locations of these mobile police stations, as well as a list of police station opening times and your Neighbourhood Policing Team officers.

Another useful digital tool is the Street Safe page. This is a service that allows you to report safety concerns in public places anonymously, including issues like poorly lit streets, abandoned buildings, or vandalism, as well as instances where you feel unsafe due to someone following or verbally abusing you.

On the OPCC website you can find my latest Police and Crime Plan which was developed after an in-depth public consultation period with the public, local stakeholders, and policing professionals with both local, regional and national input. It outlines the main priorities for the force up until 2029, which is also helpful to keep up to date with areas of focus.

Delivery against the Police and Crime Plan is recorded quarterly in Highlight and Performance reports which are also published on the OPCC website as well as presented to the Police and Crime Panel.

I encourage all residents to explore these various tools and webpages, bookmark them, and use them to stay informed and engaged with policing in your communities.



If British Summer Time and warmer days mean you will be visiting one of Dorset and Wiltshire's local heathlands or outdoors spaces to enjoy the wildlife and wilderness, please take a picnic.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) is encouraging residents and visitors to bring a picnic and not a barbecue when out and about. Warmer and breezy weather increases the risk of accidental or deliberate fires in our open spaces.

A wildfire can move at speeds faster than an Olympic sprinter, so we are asking everyone to follow some simple steps:

- If you are enjoying our open spaces when a fire occurs, get to a safe place and call the fire service on 999 immediately, with as much information as possible.
- Consider downloading and using What3Words to identify your exact location.
- You can also help by reporting any anti-social behaviour on our heaths and open spaces to the Police on 101.

Landowners and land managers are also advised, where possible, to be prepared for fires and ensure that fire breaks are cut and well maintained with any cut grasses and vegetation removed from the site.

Hot July brings cooling showers, Apricots and gillyflowers...

As I sit writing this in the melting heat of Summer Solstice, some cooling showers would be most welcome. We have certainly had a summer this year!

We now roll towards the end of the school year, a sense of culmination of work done and school children and teachers coming together to celebrate achievements, before scattering to be with families for holidays and breaks, and before gathering together again in the Autumn.

This pattern of all coming together at high season reminds me of the Feast of Pentecost that we recently celebrated. The disciples had followed Jesus for three years, learning and making notes, and they were about to graduate with a spectacular, drop-the-mike graduation event. They were all gathered together waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit which arrived like a great gale of wind and, instead of mortar boards, tongues of flame landed on each disciple's head. They each became empowered for their life's task and went out far and wide preaching the new message of love and redemption – it was quite the summer project they were given!

My current obsession is reading a lot of Arthurian literature (in between books on Celtic Saints) as it seems to hold a key for the

interweaving of pagan and Christian themes. Arthur and his Knights, mirroring the disciples, meet every Pentecost. It is recognised as a time of empowerment.

Pentecost was a time when King Arthur hosted a great and grand feast for his lords and ladies with his Knights at the Round Table. It was customary for Arthur to wait for a marvel to occur before beginning the feast, which usually involved someone entering with news of a strange or wonderful event, or a quest, or challenge. The ultimate one was the call to the quest of the Holy Grail that I talked about at our Solstice event. That quest was a bit of a leap for Arthur's Knights. Definitely the end of primary teaching and moving on to the school of big life lessons.

I wonder how many of you out there are completing something, having a summer break and then starting something new and big in September? Two of my colleagues hope to, as they look towards starting ordination training in September. Theirs really will be a Quest for the Holy Grail.

Whether the summer you plan will be a holy quest, a pilgrimage, a time of recuperation, or you will have the challenge of dragons to conquer or subdue, may God go with you and the Spirit guide you.
