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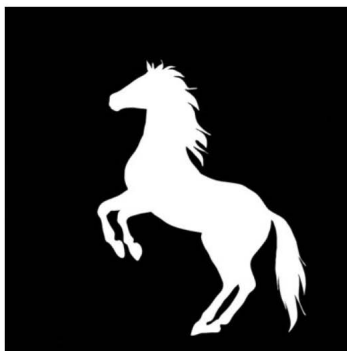

Crimes and incidents

Wiltshire Police record crimes and incidents in accordance with the National Crime and incident recording standards. Not all incidents that one would consider a crime are necessarily classified as a crime for recording purposes.

NB- The below statistics do not account for incidents that police respond to but do not need any follow up (Road traffic incidents, minor incidents of Anti-social behaviour)

From 1st April 2025 – 30th June 2025:

- **0 crimes and 10 incidences have been recorded in the Parish area.**
- **There have been 0 Report of dwelling burglaries.**
- **There have been 0 reports in relation to theft of or theft from Motor vehicles.**

Having reviewed the crime data for the area – There are no apparent trends that are presented or a series of crimes that are linked.

Apples

We are still after your apples, to make our lovely apple juice.
If they are going to be ready for the 17th August, you could bring them with you to the Farmers' Market.
Please pick your apples just a day or so before you bring them, keep them in an open box, or paper/woven bag, no plastic bags (we don't want them getting too sweaty), and they should be ripe—either windfalls, or picked with just a quarter twist. No rot, mould, mud - slight bruises are okay, if you'd eat it we can press it into good tasting juice.

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Thinking ahead about Emergencies

Have you ever thought ahead about what steps you might need to take now to make sure you and your family are as safe as possible if there are problems locally.

Obviously we all hope we will never have to face an emergency, but maybe it is time to put one or two things in place in advance. Problems with the water, electricity or oil supplies could have real impact on you, particularly if you are a little vulnerable. Now might be the time to make sure you have let the services know you need to be considered.

Have you made the best efforts to plan ahead?

If you or a loved one are living with:

- A disability or health condition which requires electricity or a consistent supply of water
- A difficulty hearing, deafness, being blind or partially sighted
- A mental health condition
- Mobility restraints
- Age related problems (i.e. pensionable age)
- A child or children under five

...then you can register for **Priority Services** with both Thames Water and SSE, which will allow them to provide you with additional services (depending on what your needs are), in case of an interruption in supply.

For Heating Oil:

Oil delivery companies participating in the Cold Weather Priority Scheme, hold a register of those who might need priority deliveries. If you are over 75, you could qualify. Check with your local supplier or look up

for participating companies.

If you have difficulties with using the internet or with filling out the forms, do please ask a neighbour, friend or relative to help you.

Do you know of someone who lives close to you who may need to be on these priority service registers. If so please offer to help them sign up. Perhaps swap details with them so you can help if the need arises.

Some Simple things to do in advance to help yourself:

- Write down a list of important telephone numbers for relatives, friends neighbours and services. Keep it handy.
- If you think you might need help in some circumstances, make sure you have told a neighbour so that they can check in on you.
- Keep a list of your regular medication.
- Remind yourself how to turn off your water and electricity in case you are asked to do so.
- Check the batteries on your smoke alarms regularly.
- Sign up to get alerts for severe weather and flooding
- Check your insurance is up to date and keep the policy number and telephone number on your important numbers sheet.
- Work out how you would get out of your home in a fire, or a flood.

The Government website page **Get Prepared for Emergencies**, has lots of useful information and has a handy Household Plan document you can download and complete.

Put together an emergency kit of items at home

This could include:

- **Battery or wind-up torch** – torches are safer than candles.
- **Portable power bank** for charging your mobile phone.
- **Battery or wind-up radio** to get updates during a power cut – a car radio can be used, however in severe weather it might be safer to stay inside.
- **Spare batteries** for torches and radio and a backup battery for any medical equipment you rely on.
- **A first aid kit (or some first aid items)** including items such as waterproof plasters, bandages, a thermometer, antiseptic, eyewash solution, sterile dressings and gloves, medical tape for dressings, and tweezers.
- **Hand sanitiser and wet wipes** for hygiene purposes when the water is off.
- **Bottled water** – there is no standard figure for this as emergencies can vary in duration and people use different amounts. A minimum of 2.5-3 litres of drinking water per person per day is recommended by the World Health Organisation for survival. 10 litres per person per day will make you more comfortable by also providing for basic cooking and hygiene needs. Additional water might be needed to make up baby formula, for medical devices and for pets.
- **Non-perishable food** that doesn't need cooking, such as ready-to-eat tinned meat, fruit or vegetables (and a tin opener). As with water, how much you need will vary based on your own circumstances. Don't forget food for pets.
- **Baby supplies** such as nappies and baby formula – ready made or 'ready-to-feed' formula is best as you may not be able to boil water or sterilise bottles.

Rather than buying all the items at once, you could just add to your emergency kit when you are able and build it up over time.

Trustees of Broad Hinton Village Hall (BHVH)

Role and Responsibilities



1. Maintain an effective board of trustees, managers and volunteers

Have sufficient trustees, who possess an appropriate balance of skills, experience and knowledge to make informed decisions. Seek independent, professional advice in areas where the board lacks skills. Plan for succession.

2. Describe BHVH's purpose

Clearly articulate BHVH's purpose and aims and ensure these are being delivered effectively and sustainably.

3. Define strategic goals

Discuss and define goals which contribute to achieving the purpose. Make informed, rigorous collective and timely decisions which work towards achieving these.

4. Define Policy:

- Data Protection & Privacy
- Hiring & Usage
- Health & Safety
- Design Guidelines for marketing & communications

5. Manage Finances

Control and manage BHVH's finances through a rigorous process of setting budgets, quarterly reviews and end-of-year reporting.

6. Control Risk

Identify, assess and control risks by carrying out risk assessments and setting up and monitoring management systems.

7. Comply with Regulations

Understand and comply with legal and regulatory requirements relating to the building and the trust.

8. Strategic Fundraising

Developing strategic relationship with potential funders.

9. Delegate effectively to managers and volunteers

Delegate the management and running of BHVH to suitable, capable individuals, either trustees, managers or volunteers. Assign a trustee to each management group for monitoring and communication purposes.

10. Communicate and act with transparency and accountability

Engage with the general community, community groups, hirers and other stakeholders. Remain aware of the importance of the community's scrutiny, confidence and trust.

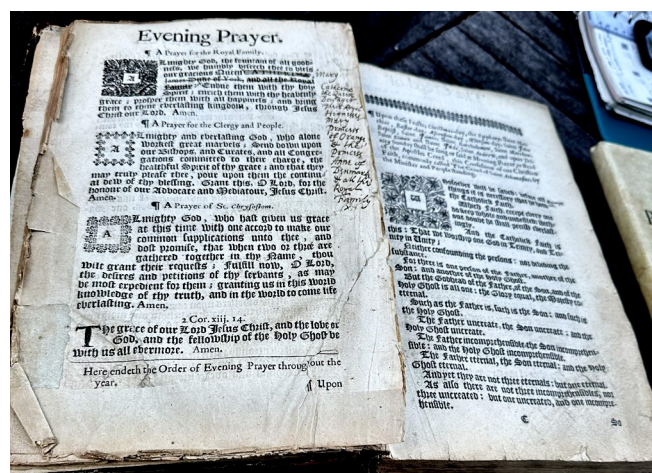

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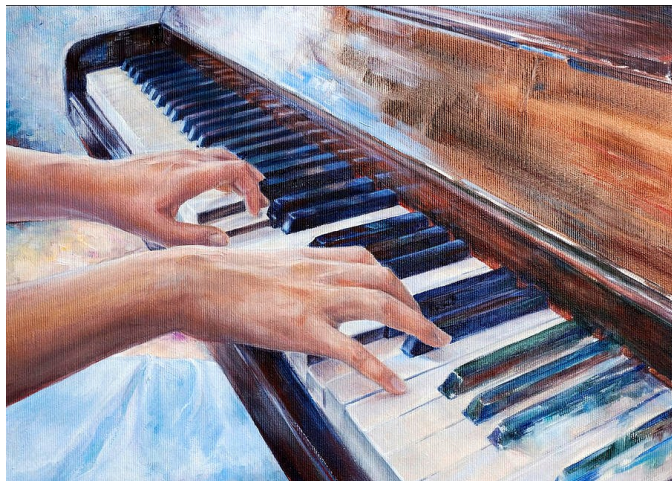

CALLING ALL KEYBOARD PLAYERS!

As you'll all know, we have seven churches in our Parish, and organs used for worship in five of them – Avebury, Broad Hinton, West Overton, Fyfield and Winterbourne Monkton, plus an electric keyboard often used in East Kennett. We have a group of three who play for services. For many Sundays this is enough, since generally there only two simultaneous services with hymns on any given Sunday. But in practice we are often stretched to cover the needs of the churches, due to commitments elsewhere, holiday absences, etc.

So we should love to have more players to join the panel. You do not need to be a trained organist to play! Any keyboard player capable of playing hymn tunes on the piano or electric keyboard can do the same on the organ. It is not necessary to use the pedal board, and any of us existing players can teach you which stops to use on the organ in 10 or 20 minutes. You will soon come to love the organ – a glorious instrument! – and one with a great repertoire if you want to explore further.

VIEW FROM THE RECTORY

Traditionally we celebrate harvest in September/October when 'all is safely gathered in, ere the winter storms begin'. But the latter half of July under the buck moon saw farmers and their combine harvesters - these days epic pieces of kit - hard at work bringing in the crop. Nature wins with its beauty and divine design but there is something also pleasing about a piece of machinery, beautifully crafted to do its job, that is satisfying to see. David White's photos this year of combine harvesters at work at dusk and dawn show the intense beauty of the land and sky in harmony with the ingenuity of human design.

We celebrate the first fruits of the harvest with a feast shared by church and pagans alike: Lammas (or loaf-mass). An expression of gratitude and acknowledgement of the earth's gifts given to us every year, by making a loaf of the first grain and sharing it in community.

In Celtic mythology Lammas is also associated with the god Lugh (so the feast is also called Lughnasad). Interestingly he is said to represent skill, craftsmanship and the sun, which brings those images to mind once more of the great combine machines framed by glorious sunrises and sunsets in the Wiltshire countryside.

The traditional time of Lammas is 1st August between summer solstice and autumn equinox and celebrating this with bread has lots of profound resonances. One thing that defines human beings is that we are 'bread eaters'. We take grain and we transmute it (quite literally 'raise' it). We use that mysterious element fire (mythically an expression of consciousness) and

bread becomes a symbol of human life for we are beings who shape the world around us. It is recognised that the importance of bread led to an uptake in agricultural activities and so we formed larger villages and settlements. The result of this contributed to the creation of cities worldwide and in shaping what we experience as modern day society.

It is no mistake that in the church we use and celebrate what Jesus did with bread. We humans took grain and by heat and yeast raised it into bread. Jesus then took bread and through his own biography transmuted and raised it into a food that raises our consciousness further. The Eucharist is a ceremony that invites us to take our civilization onto the next level. The possibilities of where that could take us as a society if we really engage with it is truly breathtaking. As Thomas Aquinas put it *Panis angelicus fit panis hominum* — the bread of angels has become the bread of humankind. Our responsibility is to then do something with that gift. No pressure!

While we wait for that to work itself out in God's good time let's continue to break bread with each other in fellowship and in loving community. Something I've greatly enjoyed doing with you since I arrived 6 months ago.

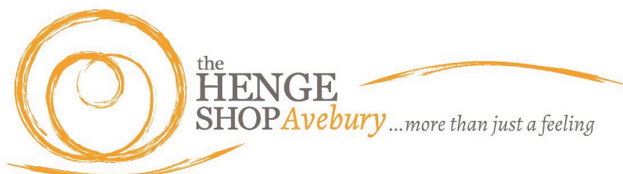
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
